The Children's Therapeutic Learning Center provides a unique and highly specialized program for young children facing the challenges of Autism Spectrum Disorders and their families.


Utilizing research-proven principles from Early Childhood Special Education, Applied Behavioral Analysis and the Developmental, Individual-difference, Relationship-based (DIR) Model, the classroom-based program supports young children in improving their ability to form positive, meaningful relationships and communicate effectively with caregivers and peers. In addition, the evidence-based program emphasizes skill acquisition in all areas of child development.

Staffed by highly trained professionals from a variety of disciplines, the program provides low adult/child ratios to maximize the benefit to children enrolled and allow for frequent contact and consultation with parents and/or caregivers.

Quarterly home visits help engage the family as treatment partners and assist parents in their ability to understand their child's condition and effectively work to improve their child's functioning in all areas of daily life.
